Stewardship

Easter is a moveable feast. Easter isn't on the same calendar date every year in the way that Christmas is always celebrated on December 25. The date for Easter each year always falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring equinox. And once you find the date of Easter, everything else finds its place—Good Friday and Maundy Thursday, Ash Wednesday and the Transfiguration, the Ascension of our Lord and Pentecost.

All this is a long way of saying that Easter determines everything. Easter defines everything. It orders not only the entire church year, but it orders our very lives. It defines and gives meaning to our lives, as well to the things that happen in them. And since Easter defines everything, that means it changes everything too. It redefines who we are and where we stand with God and with one another. Easter makes all things new.

Without Easter, Jesus would not be raised from the dead. Without Easter death would still reign, we would still be in our trespasses and sins, and our faith and hope would be in vain. But Jesus is raised from the dead. Easter changes everything. It makes all things new. Therefore, darkness is overcome with light, wrath with peace, fear with hope, angst with rest, sadness with joy, hatred with love, sin with righteousness, and death with life. Easter changes everything, redefines everything, determines everything. Easter makes all things new.

Thus, Easter also changes our attitude about giving. For if God gave us His own Son into death so that we will live, how will He not give us everything else we need? He will, and He does. He provides for us. He even gives us the gifts that we give back to Him for service in the church. Easter demonstrates that we have a God who loves us, a God who provides for us, a God who presses us into His service, a God who has made us new in the death and resurrection of His Son.

For when you give to the church, you pass along those things that God alone has given to you. You pass along the message to others that Easter changes everything and makes all things new, even as it has done this for you. This is not a burden, but pure joy. For God has given you a part in the administration of His kingdom. He provides for the needy through your hands. He ensures that the Gospel is preached and the Sacraments are given out through the work of your hands and in the gifts that you give. And He honors and blesses this work and generosity as it redounds to those around you.

So when you sit down on the first day of the week to make your offering to the place where Easter is proclaimed and where the gifts of Easter are given out, remember: Easter changes everything. It makes all things new. More than that: Easter has changed you and made you new. Because Jesus who was crucified for our transgressions is raised for our justification.

MISSION LUTHERAN CHURCH Council Meeting February 21, 2017

President Greg Fant called the meeting to order at 6:33 p.m. Attending were Greg Fant, Jim Vance, John Guenther, Doug Lorenz, Frank Brennan, Megan Wood, Ruth Staffeldt, Dianne Wensel, Jan Peyton and guest, Carol Moore. Devotion and prayer were led by Doug Lorenz.

Minutes of the January 17, 2016, meeting were approved as submitted.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Greg reported that the final adult confirmation class has been rescheduled to Tuesday, February 28. Mary Provencio, Amie Springer, and Al Lujan are to be confirmed March 5.

<u>President's Report</u>: Greg said that he has appointed Robert Scaling and Kay Swedberg as the elected members of the Board of Fellowship, to be ratified at the next Voters' Assembly meeting.

<u>Prayer Ministry</u>: Jan Peyton reminded the Council that the Staff/Leadership Prayer Shield meets monthly. She and Carol Moore coordinate prayer targets for these sessions. Jan asked each member to contact her or Carol with your requests for prayer.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: See attached report submitted by John Guenther. John noted that two capital projects are being paid out of savings. These projects are reflected in actual results with transfer from savings to designated revenue and payments included in MLC expense. Because these offset one another, there is no impact on the budget bottom line.

Greg asked John if he had historical tracking of church attendance and general contributions. John does review these items and will provide a graph of each to the Council members.

<u>Elders' Report</u>: See attached report submitted by Doug Lorenz. The Elders have completed their review of the membership rolls. After discussion, the group agreed that those no longer wishing to be members would be removed from the official reporting. A few people did not respond to inquiries. Doug will identify these individuals at the Voters' Assembly meeting, asking for help in contacting these people. It is important to keep the rolls accurate, as we pay District a subsidy for each member.

<u>Day School Board Report</u>: See attached report submitted by Megan Wood. The LCSC Assessment Report received from Rob Cooksey is attached. Kathy Mailander was unable to attend the Board meeting so the fundraising items in the LCSC assessment report were not discussed. However, Megan has been able to talk with Kathy and learned that Kathy was somewhat disappointed. She did gather some useful suggestions, but Kathy felt that many would not apply to Mission School for a long time because we are small. For now, Kathy will be concentrating on identifying and contacting prospective corporate/business sponsors. She will reinstitute restaurant nights, as these have been successful in the past. Other fundraising activities to be discussed further include opening up the annual auction to the community and scheduling a pop-up

restaurant, with entertainment, and sell tickets in advance.

<u>Trustees' Report</u>: Frank Brennan reported that the painting in Luther Hall would be completed February 23. New blinds have been ordered for the library. We are still waiting for the gate to be repaired.

Frank presented an estimate from RT Electric Co., copy attached, to replace the exterior lights, including the parking lot, with new LED light fixtures. RT Electric identified that El Paso Electric Co. will pay part of the cost of the upgrade. Frank moved, and Doug Lorenz seconded, that this capital project be submitted to the Voters for approval. The motion passed.

Stewardship Report: See attached report submitted by Jerry Stickles.

<u>Christian Service and Missions</u>: See attached report submitted by Ruth Staffeldt. Ruth indicated that the work with the young man discussed in the last paragraph would be ongoing.

Evangelism Report: Nothing to report.

<u>Fellowship Report:</u> Doug Lorenz reported that a FUN Night would not be scheduled for March 7, as the weekly Lent soup supper will be offered the next day.

The next meeting will be held March 21 at 6:30 p.m.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
